



Women's History Month

March is National Women's History Month, a celebration of women's contributions to history, culture, and community. In many tribes, American Indian and Alaskan Native women had a wide range of roles as leaders, craftswomen, healers, builders, farmers, and warriors. Here are just a few women we'd like to highlight this month:

Around the year 1844, Thoc-me-tony, or "Shell Flower," was born to the Paiute tribe of Nevada. Winnemucca became a translator for the United States' Indian Office. As such, the National Park Service explains how she helped relocate bands to reservations and negotiated on the behalf of tribes for more supplies and support. Her witnessing of the poor conditions of these facilities as well as the treatment of Native Americans in general made her an outspoken advocate for Native American rights. She pointed out the hypocrisy of American ideals of liberty and equality versus the actual treatment and conditions of her people.

On August 15th, 1999, hundreds of people gathered on the lawn of the State Indian Museum to celebrate the 100th birthday of Bertha Nye Norton, Hupa Yurok. "Grandma Norton" as she was known to many was proclaimed the oldest California Indian alive, living eventually through 2 turns of the century. Her influence as a cultural practitioner, midwife, and storyteller is revered in community. The California Governor Gray Davis proclaimed August 15th as "Grandma Norton Day" as is recognized as one of the founding mothers and grandmothers of California and Sacramento.



Annie Dodge Wauneka was an influential member of the Navajo Nation as a member of the Navajo Nation Council. She focused her platform on education and healthcare. Her two main objectives were to eradicate tuberculosis within her Native American nation and to create a dictionary to help medical professionals translate medical terms from English to the Navajo language. Some of her greatest achievements include being awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by Lyndon B. Johnson as well as the Indian Council Fire Achievement Award and the Navajo Medal of Honor. She also became the second woman to be elected to the Tribal Council.


