


POW WOW SWEAT

Utility Assistance Onetime Benefit Issuance

Due to increased costs experienced by our families for utilities and heating this winter, Shingle Springs Tribal TANF will be issuing a one-time supplement to each family, who are active participants in our four-county service area.

- This will be a one-time issuance of \$500.00 in March 2022, funded by the COVID-19 PEAF funds under the guidance of ACF.
- This service will be automatically disbursed, Families will not have to request this supplement. Receipts for utility payments will not be required.
