Who is Eligible?

- At least one child in any household must be Native American or Alaska Native
- Proof of immediate need such as power shutoff, eviction notice, etc.
- You must reside in Sacramento, El Dorado, Placer or Yolo county
- Total household income must be at or below 400% of federal poverty guidelines (For your reference, take a look at the chart below.)

How Can Money from the Pandemic Emergency Assistance Funds (PEAF) be Used?

- One-time cash benefit
- Emergency Housing and short-term homeless assistance
- Emergency food aid
- Short-term utilities payments
- Burial Assistance
- Clothing allowance
- Back-to-school assistance
- PPE voucher for entire family
